TOURNAMENT REGISTRATION

Step 1: Participating Coaches NCAA Approval Process

You can click on this link to go through the certification process, please remember to put it on your team registration page. This is mandatory in order to be able to coach during this tournament.

This process will cost you \$40 to complete and results will be completed in approximately 3 to 7 business days. INORDER FOR ANY COACH (including assistants) TO SIT ON THE BENCH DURING THE EVENT THIS PROCESS MUST BE COMPLETED BEFORE YOU ARRIVE IN LAS VEGAS. FOR THE TOURNAMENT TO REMAIN A CERTIFIED NCAA SUMMER EVENT, THIS PROCESS WILL BE ENFORCED WITH NO EXCEPTIONS. Don't wait to last minute to do this. Some coaches during last summer's events had to sit out their first couple of games because they did not complete this process before they arrived.

Step 2: NCAA Team Registration Requirement

The required information for teams entering NCAA certified events (filling out rosters with all player and coaches information) can be found at the link below. At the bottom of the page you must also opt your team into the NW Premier Showcase Tournament on the site in order to compete in the tournament.

TOURNAMENT CHECK-IN

All teams must check in at Bellevue College prior to your first game to get tournament packet, t-shirts and have your team(s) watch the mandatory NCAA video. Coaches will need to show picture id and verify that all information on their rosters is correct at the time of check-in.

Video will be shown every half an hour starting at 8am on July 9 until 9pm and continue at 8am on July 10 until 6pm at Bellevue College. You and your entire team will be required to attend an educational session during these times to review NCAA initial eligibility standards, gambling, agents and drug use. All players and coaches are required to attend. After you attend this session your team will receive their tournament t-shirts. If you do not attend a session prior to your first game, your team will be eliminated from participating in upcoming event games.

TOURNAMENT GUIDELINES

PARTICIPATING PLAYER RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

All prospective players participating in the event must reside in:

1. The same state as their team's official address; or
2. A adjoining state, provided that no more than three team member(s) reside in adjoining states.

FOR OUR TOURNAMENT TO REMAIN A CERTIFIED NCAA SUMMER EVENT WE ARE REQUIRED TO VERIFY PRIOR TO COMPETITION THAT ALL PARTICIPANTS HAVE MET THE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS.

In situations in which a team includes players from a metropolitan area located on a state border, the team may include more than three team members from adjoining states as long as each additional player resides within the metropolitan area. Residency is determined by the player's legal residence or the legal residence of his parent or legal guardian. An international player may use the legal address of the player's host family, provided the player, for a minimum of one academic year, has been a part of an educational exchange program or has attended high school locally while residing with the host family. Prep school players can use the address of the prep school for residency purposes if they have attended the prep school for at least one school year previous to the tournament.

PROHIBITIVE CONTACT

No team coach or player can have contact with any NCAA coach during the tournament. This includes, but is not limited to, the game sites as well as the hotel. At the game sites teams and coaches will be required to enter and sit on the opposite side of the gymnasium from the NCAA coaches. Please cooperate. Our gym site supervisors will strictly enforce this provision, as our NCAA certification depends on it.

PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

In order for a player to be eligible to participate in the event, he must have high school eligibility remaining or be going to enroll in his first year of prep school in the fall of 2010 and meet the NCAA residency rule discussed above. **A GRADUATED SENIOR IS INELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE TOURNAMENT IF HE PLANS TO ATTEND A 2 OR 4 YEAR COLLEGE IN THE FALL OF 2010.**

CODE OF CONDUCT

NW Premier Showcase demands a certain level of conduct from all coaches, players and fans participating in the tournament.

The following penalties will impose:

- Any coach, player or fan ejected from his team's game by a referee, gym supervisor or tournament official must leave there gym immediately and will not be allowed into the for the team's next game. Two ejections will result in expulsion for the remainder of the tournament.
- Each team is responsible for all damages caused by any member of its party. It is the sole responsibility of the team's administration to make good on all claims by hotels, transportation rental agencies or playing sites where the damage occurred.

TOURNAMENT RULES

Playing rules are those adopted by the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations with the following exceptions:

- Games will be played in two 16-minute stop clock halves.
- No shot clock will be used.
- There will be a minimum of 5-minutes between games and half times will be 2-minutes.
- A player will foul out on his 6th foul.
- Intentional and technical fouls will result in an automatic two points and ball out of bounds.
- Each team will be allowed two full & two 30-second timeouts per game. One timeout per overtime.
- First overtime is 2-minutes. Second overtime is 1-minute. Third overtime is first team to 2-points.
- Tournament Director will have final say on any disputes that occur throughout the tournament.

ADMISSION

Daily admission for spectators is \$8 & \$6 (seniors and 10-18 yr olds). Tournament pass is \$20.
